Currently, Greg is serving on a Developmental Assignment as a Program Manager with the National Planning Center of Expertise for Ecosystem Restoration (ECO-PCX). His permanent position is as the Chief, Flood Plain Management Section, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Norfolk District. Greg also serves as an Account Manager for the ECO-PCX.

Greg's responsibilities include completing Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM) updates for FEMA, along with assistance in the development of the Virginia Hurricane Evacuation Study for the Virginia Department of Emergency Management.
